

The Evolution of the American Gospel Part 6 - The Evolution Completed - The other gospel

The Acts of the Apostles opens in Chapter 1 with Yeshua and His Apostles and closes in Acts 28 with Apostle Paul.

As Paul's Life and Ministry began to come to a close, before he was sent to Rome to be judged by Caesar, Paul is being accused of teaching against the Law and is identified as a ringleader of the sect of the Nazarene.

- Ac 24:1 And after five days Ananias the high priest descended with the elders, and *with* a certain orator *named* Tertullus, who informed the governor against Paul.
- Ac 24:2 And when he was called forth, Tertullus began to accuse *him*, saying, Seeing that by thee we enjoy great quietness, and that very worthy deeds are done unto this nation by thy providence,
- Ac 24:3 We accept *it* always, and in all places, most noble Felix, with all thankfulness.
- Ac 24:4 Notwithstanding, that I be not further tedious unto thee, I pray thee that thou wouldest hear us of thy clemency a few words.
- Ac 24:5 For we have found this man *a* pestilent *fellow*, and a mover of sedition among all the Jews throughout the world, and a ringleader of the sect of the Nazarenes:
- Ac 24:6 Who also hath gone about to profane the temple: whom we took, and would have judged according to our law.

Ringleader – 4414 πρωτοστάτης protostates {pro-tos-tat'-ace}

Meaning: 1) one who stands in the front rank 1a) a leader, chief, champion

Usage: AV - ringleader 1; 1

Sect – 139 αίρεσις hairesis {hah'-ee-res-is}

Meaning: 1) act of taking, capture: e.g. storming a city 2) choosing, choice 3) that which is chosen 4) **a body of men following their own tenets (sect or party)** 4a) of the Sadducees 4b) of the Pharisees 4c) of the Christians 5) dissensions arising from diversity of opinions and aims

Usage: AV - sect 5, heresy 4; 9

The term **cult** usually refers to a social group defined by its religious, spiritual, or philosophical beliefs, or its common interest in a particular personality, object, or goal.

Nazarene – 3480 Ναζωραῖος Nazoraios {nad-zo-rah'-yos}

Meaning: Nazarite = "one separated" 1) an inhabitant of Nazareth 2) a title given to Jesus in the NT 3) a name given to Christians by the Jews, Ac. 24:5

Usage: AV - of Nazareth 13, Nazarene 2; 15

The faith once delivered to the Saints has its origin in Israel. The faith was distinctively Hebrew, but as the faith made its way from Israel it began to become less Hebrew in nature and culture and more Greek, then Latin and European.

Religion came to America from Europe by way of the Pilgrims. The Pilgrims were Protestants. The United States is the first western country to be established by Protestants.

As religion evolved in America, it embodied more of the American culture. America at its roots is defiant of religion, yet America is very religious.

Pilgrims came to America fleeing religious persecution from King Henry VIII of England. King Henry VIII had broken away from the Catholic Church and the authority of the Pope and declared himself as head of the Church of England.

Deists believe in the existence of God, on purely rational grounds, without any reliance on revealed religion, religious authority, or holy text.

In a quote by Albert Einstein, directed to Rabbi Herbert Goldstein in 1929, he describes the essence of Deism: "I believe in Spinoza's God, who reveals Himself in the lawful harmony of the world, not in a God who concerns Himself with the fate and the doings of mankind."

Spinoza was a Dutch philosopher of Sephardi/Portuguese origin.

On 27 July 1656, the Talmud Torah congregation of Amsterdam excommunicated Spinoza from the Jewish community.

Religion has impacted every aspect of American culture and society because religious freedom is embedded in the US Constitution. Every politician must swear an oath to uphold these religious freedoms before taking office.

The inclusion of religious freedom (at the time, Christianity) in the US Constitution has led many to conclude that America is a Christian nation, controlled primarily by Christians, or at least those who believed in God.

Under Article 6 of the Constitution, "The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and the Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both of the United States and of the several States, shall be bound by Oath or Affirmation, to support this Constitution; but no religious Test shall ever be required as a Qualification to any Office or public Trust under the United States."

Regardless of faith, someone can become a Senator, or Representative, or even President of the United States.

The 1st Amendment to the US Constitution states, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

Free elections and voting rights have been referred to as a "sacred process" in which every American must participate.

American history at its core has paved the way for denomination of choice, religious fanaticism, and guarantees the freedom and protection of religions such as Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, Sikhism, and any other religion one can create or invent.

Democracy is a Greek word meaning “rule of the people” or “the people rule”. The structure of democracy is that the people, who rule, choose leaders to rule on their behalf as their representatives.

A Representative must be 25 years old and a citizen for 7 years.

Every US Representative and Senator must swear an oath on the Bible to uphold the Constitution. They do not swear on the Bible to uphold the Laws of YeHoVaH; they swear to uphold the laws of men.

When the US Constitution was formed, America was perceived to be primarily a Christian country. That has changed. Today people swear an oath on the religious book of their choice.

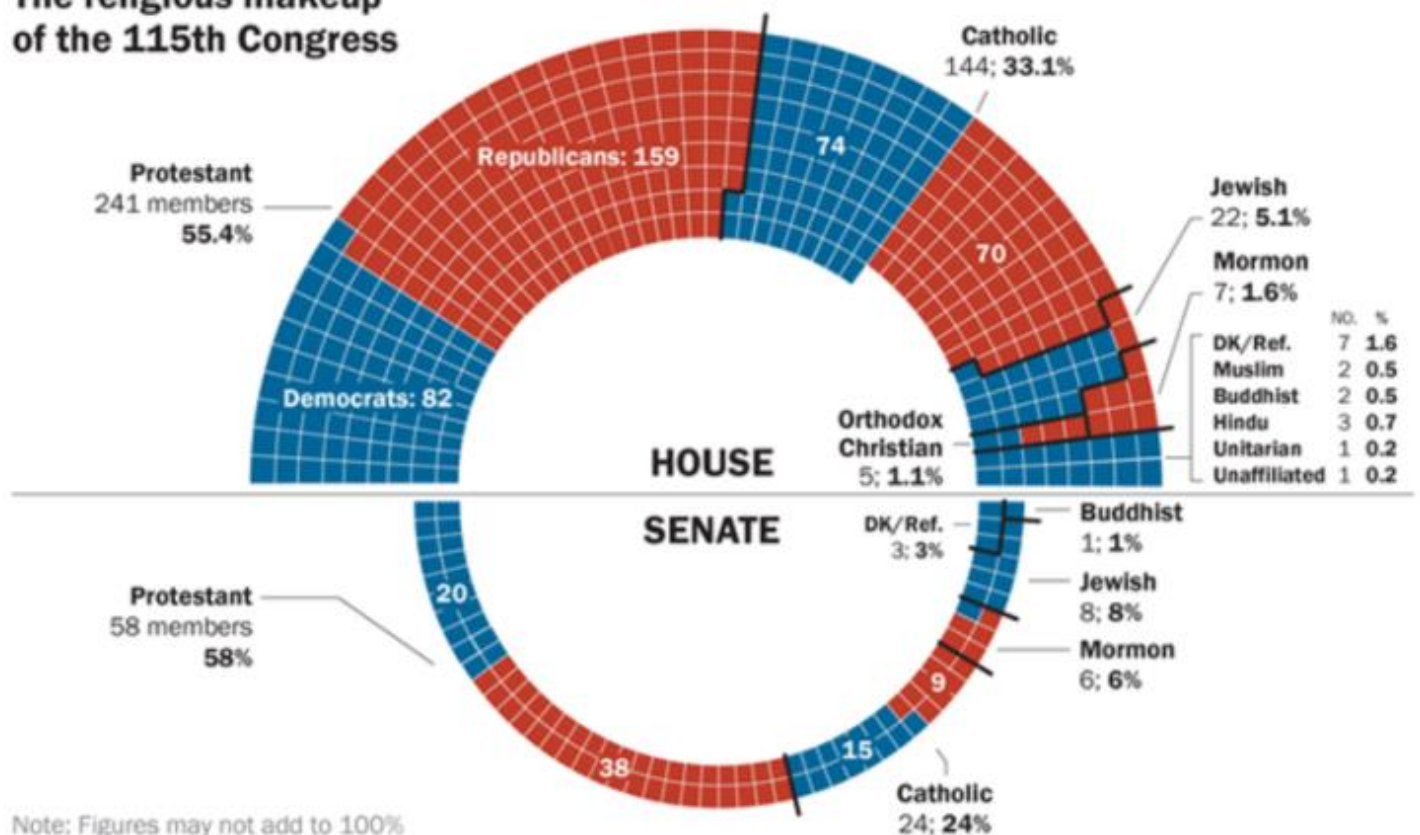

Ps 24:0 A Psalm of David.

Ps 24:1 The earth *is* the LORD'S, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.

Ps 24:2 For he hath founded it upon the seas, and established it upon the floods.

Ps 24:3 Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? or who shall stand in his holy place?

Ps 24:4 He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully.

Ps 24:5 He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

Ps 24:6 This *is* the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, O Jacob. Selah.

Ps 24:9 Lift up your heads, O ye gates; even lift *them* up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in.

Ps 24:10 Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he *is* the King of glory. Selah.
